Rev. David's Quote of the Week

Rabbi Abraham Heschel (1907 - 1972), one of the most influential theologians of the 20th century, wrote: "Our goal should be to live life in radical amazement. . . Get up in the morning and look at the world in a way that takes nothing for granted. Everything is phenomenal; everything is incredible; never treat life casually. To be spiritual is to be amazed."

As a conscious discipline, taking nothing for granted seems simple, and yet it takes no more than a moment to realize how often our out-of-focus (or over-focused) attention passes by the phenomenal reality of our commonplace surroundings and circumstances. Pausing for wonder is an essential spiritual practice. Is there time for you to try it today?
