UU minister and prominent Washington, DC public figure A. Powell Davies (1902 - 1957) wrote:

"Life must have its sacred moments and holy places. We need the infinite, the limitless, the uttermost — all that can give the heart a deep and strengthening peace. We need religion with its faith and purpose; we need it as experience. We need the touch of beauty, bringing back to life its luster and its loveliness. We need the unutterable communion of our spirits with the spirit of the highest— all that joins the soul with what it yearns for, all that can raise the frailty of our incomplete humanity toward the level of the spirit's aspirations—that our earthly dust may meet and mingle with the majesty and mystery of god."

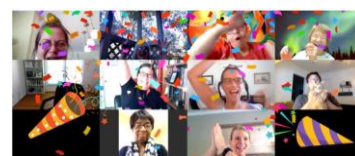
