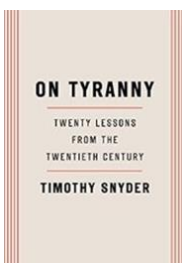

Minister's Message



This Sunday, I'll be with you via Zoom this Sunday. We will look at some peacemakers together. I hope you can come to the meetinghouse to fellowship with one another. Of course you can also join via Zoom.

Last week, I spoke at a panel of the Pikes Peak Interfaith Coalition in Colorado Springs alongside a Quaker, a Lutheran, and a member of the Church of Jesus Christ, Latter Day Saints (sometimes called LDS or Mormons). We all spoke about the different rituals that we all engage in. It was a lot of fun for us and the enthusiastic crowd that gathered.

One of the things those of us on the panel did at the end was share what we appreciated about the other panelists' faith traditions. I said that I loved what the Lutheran pastor said about their tradition being committed to 'always reforming.' I said that I loved that the Quaker leader said that they see in everyone the sacred light. And I said that I loved the way the LDS leader spoke about their commitment to caring for their congregants and their community.

I wonder: As you look at the religious pluralism within the congregation at UUCOB and among the folks in the Outer Banks, what do you find to appreciate about difference and diversity? How do you bring an appreciative spirit to our differences?

Whatever you call yourself, or don't, I pray that the spirit of adventure and appreciation is with you now and always.
